UNITED STATES - IMPORT RESTRICTIONS ON CERTAIN PRODUCTS FROM BRAZIL

Request by Brazil

The following communication dated 22 August 1988 has been received by the Director-General from the Permanent Mission of Brazil.

- 1. On July 22nd, 1988, the Government of the United States of America announced its intention to impose trade restrictions on a number of Brazilian export items, because of alleged damage to the US pharmaceutical industry resulting from Brazilian legislation on patents. A list of products was subsequently published in the "Federal Register".
- 2. This unilateral and discriminatory action constitutes a blatant disrespect of the provisions of the General Agreement. The declared intention of the U.S. Government's action is to force a modification of long-standing Brazilian legislation. This legislation is in full agreement with the appropriate international conventions regarding intellectual property rights.
- 3. The implementation of the announced measures will cause a serious disruption in the bilateral trade. The mere announcement of this action is already causing serious damage to Brazilian export interests, thus impairing Brazil's rights under the GATT.
- 4. For these reasons, the Brazilian Government is requesting consultations with the U.S. Government under Article XXIII:1 of the General Agreement.
